



Bay Hill Course Notes

First 9:

1. Par 4, dogleg left. Driving range is left of the hole so be careful about cutting the corner too much. Fairway bunker dead straight through the fairway is in play if you hit drive too far or if you don't cut off some of the corner.
2. Long par 3. Long is better than short. Right is better than left. Everything on the green feeds hard right to left.
3. Par 4 dogleg left around the lake. The key on this hole is to just get a safe tee shot in play that doesn't challenge too much of the water.
4. Par 5, seems like housing (OB) is to the right, but will be one of the easier holes on the course
5. Par 4, not long, key on this hole is to determine what club to hit off the tee. The fairway has dips and undulations down by the green, so it's not necessary to hit drive as far as you can.
6. Par 5 dogleg left around the left. This hole is about hitting three shots to safe places down the right side.
7. Par 3, what you see is what you get
8. Par 4, dogleg right. Very hard hole especially if you get too aggressive off the tee. Play to the widest part of the fairway and just deal with a tough second shot. Getting too aggressive off the tee usually means trouble.
9. Long par 4, not much difficult, just long.

Second 9:

10. Par 4 dogleg right. Think about yardage and line off the tee because cutting the corner is probably necessary. Hazards come in play close to the green.
11. Difficult par 4, water left for the entire hole. Play the hole down right side if possible.
12. Par 5, what you see is what you get
13. Par 4, water in front of the green. Good drive should leave short iron in.
14. Par 3, what you see is what you get. Wind tends to be a factor on this hole.
15. Hard par 4 dogleg right. The tendency is to avoid right because OB comes into play, but through the fairway left is difficult too due to trees and heavy rough. There won't be many pars on this hole. Good luck.
16. Par 5, awesome hole you will recognize if you watch the API. Second shot lay up in front of the water will leave a short wedge into the green.
17. Long par 3, missing long is better than short. Bunker short, and especially short/right will leave you in the bunker with a long shot.
18. Enjoy the iconic signature hole. Hard par 4. Depending on which tees you play and how far you hit it, the water may be in play off the tee so check your yardage. The approach into the green is difficult because of the water in front, and how narrow the green is. The green feeds hard from left to right and back to front. If you watch the API, you'll remember seeing how they play the chips and the putts especially to the back right hole location. Consider playing as a 3-shot hole even from the fairway. If your tee ball is in the rough, it will be a mandatory 3-shot hole.
